APPENDIX II

HISTORY OF THE FAIRFIELD COUNTY SWIMMING LEAGUE

Enthusiasm for athletics is akin to “Mom” and “apple pie” in Fairfield County. Thus it is not surprising that, in the spring of 1949, several swimming and diving enthusiasts gathered to discuss the formation of a league that would sponsor fun, friendly swimming and diving competitions to be held during the summer season.

Bill Campbell, then head swim coach of the Stamford Yacht Club, and Rocky Point member Bill Smith spearheaded the effort by inviting representatives from Fairfield County clubs to a meeting that was held at the Stamford Yacht Club. Eight clubs were represented at the meeting: Stamford Yacht Club, Brooklawn Country Club, Fairfield Beach Club, Riverside Yacht Club, Rocky Point Beach Club, Shore & Country Club, Tokeneke Club, and the Wee Burn Beach Club. The end result was the formation of the “Fairfield County Swimming League” (a.k.a. “FCSL”) and the election of Bill Campbell as its first president. The first dual meet schedule was set for the summer of 1949, with the first County Championship meet scheduled to be held that August.

At that time, Stamford Yacht Club was the only club with a facility that would be appropriate for a championship meet: a real swimming pool with six lanes (100 feet in length) and a one-meter diving board. Rocky Point had a pool of sorts -- with a rock and seaweed bottom -- but, the other founding clubs had no pools at all and held their dual meets in Long Island Sound. Milbrook held meets in a pond until their first pool was built in 1959.

For years the “Counties” meet was the highlight of the summer season for swimming and diving competitors and fans. It was not at all unusual for families to plan their summer vacations around the meet schedule, often cheering on the deck with engines running and bicycles strapped atop the family station wagon in the parking lot or along the neighboring roadside of the host club. “Off to catch the ferry!” was often offered as the reason a child was being shuffled into the rear seat of a packed station wagon, with towels wrapped snugly around the dripping, but happy, little swimmer ... after all, he had “made it to Counties”!

Stamford Yacht Club won the championship in the inaugural year of the championship meet, with Rocky Point claiming second place and Wee Burn Beach Club taking third place. Stamford Yacht Club kept the title for the next five years, allowing Rocky Point a moment of glory in 1955, but SYC reclaimed the title the next year until Rocky Point snatched it back in 1958. The New Canaan Field Club held the trophy once in 1959. But, since then, several power houses have emerged, with amazingly long runs at holding on tightly to the FCSL championship title. The Milbrook Club, who hosted its home meets in a pond until their pool was completed in 1959, was the keeper of the trophy for most of the 1960’s (1960-68, to be exact), after which it was The Lake Club’s responsibility to polish the trophy for the 1969 through 1971 seasons. Newfield Swim Club was the team to beat from 1972 through 1979. But, The Lake Club did just that and housed the coveted prize for the entire decade of the 1980’s and into the 1990’s, unsuspecting that Roxbury Swim Club had forged a special niche for it to call home ... and it resided there comfortably from 1991 until 2003. The 2003 County Championship meet was a “nail biter” to say the least. At the end of the freestyle relay, the crowd looked to body language for the answer: who won? ... Rocky? ... Roxbury, again? ... then, all of a sudden, Terry Lowe was in the pool! There was no doubt! Rocky Point ended its 35-year hiatus and captured the County Championship crown! The glory was short-lived though, as Roxbury regained the title in 2004.

League membership grew slowly at first, reaching eleven clubs on the roster by 1955. In the 1950’s, when membership was still small, the FCSL enhanced its schedule with outside meets, including championship challenge-matches against the Westchester Swimming League (won 2, lost 2) and “telephone meets” against leagues in places like Columbus, Ohio (won it easily), Detroit (lost by 2 points), Philadelphia (lost by 20), and Los Angeles (“They creamed us!”).

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These telephone meets featured simultaneous starts (three swimmers per league) by firing a gun over an open telephone circuit, comparing times, and awarding matched sets of special ribbons at both locations. The ribbons were printed in Jackson Smith's basement, and a good time was had by all!

Membership expanded to 26 clubs by 1960, as a result of the great club and pool building boom of the late 1950's. When the League began, all events were 25's except for the 16 & Under 50 freestyle. IM's were not a part of the original format, and there were 6 & Under events across the pool, as well as at the beginning of the meet before the lane ropes (not lane lines!) were put up in the pool. As the League grew, so did the program: competitive divisions were formed; new events were added; consolation heats were added to the championship meet (1970); diving age groups were increased from two to three, and then to four in 1977. Three-meter diving was added as an official event in the Championships in 1974. In 1985, Water Polo was introduced to the FCSL team offerings, with the first age-group championship series held in 1988. In that year the Midget Championship went to Rocky Point Club; the Junior Championship was won by the Tokeneke Club; and, the Senior Championship was awarded to the team from Burning Tree. In 1997, the Fairfield County Swimming League was incorporated in the State of Connecticut as a non-stock, non-profit corporation. League dues, which started out as \$50 per club in 1949, have increased over the years to accommodate the level of sophistication necessary to adapt to the technology and reality of our world in the 21st century. And, it is widely believed, League members are still having fun!

And, "fun" is a key word here. "Fun," rather than competition, has been the objective of the League from its inception. Fun for the children, fun for their families, and even fun for the coaches and staff of the member clubs. Each dual meet has traditionally been a social event between clubs, often ending with a cook-out or social gathering of some sort. The competition is meant to be the means to the end: fun. But the League's objectives also include providing an opportunity to encourage the development of skills, and a sense of self-worth and pride, coupled with life lessons in the importance of team work and the ability to win and to lose with grace and dignity.

"Rules don't make things right; people make things right." But, rules are a "necessary evil" and the League has adapted as its base the rules and safety standards established by the U.S.A. Swimming, U.S. Diving and U.S. Water Polo organizations and the Department of Health and Public Safety of the State of Connecticut. The FCSL is fortunate to have the *right* people on board as well. Training opportunities for FCSL coaches and referees have been established to enable them to perform their roles with a level of professionalism that has served the members well over the years. The League has enjoyed the support of parents on the deck as volunteers and as positive role models for our children. The Fairfield County Swimming League has, and always has had, every reason to be proud of its family of competitors, their fans, and their coaches.

4. Swim Team Support Strong parent support is essential to a successful meet program. Parents of Swim Team members must be aware that their participation, acting as officials, driving to away meets, etc., is required as a condition of continuing membership in the FCSL. The Club must be willing and able to host its fair share of dual meets and of County Divisional Championships each summer.
5. Facilities The facilities of new or member club should meet, or approximately meet United States Swimming, Inc., United States Diving, Inc., and United States Water Polo Inc.'s minimum requirements, and adhere to all State and Local health & safety codes:
 - a. 25 meter or 25 yard pool with at least 4 but preferably 6 lanes.
 - b. Competitive swimming area of adequate depth (4'6" strongly recommended) and width.
 - c. Standard starting blocks.
 - d. Standard competition diving board with at least a 1-meter, preferably also a 3-meter platform and adjustable fulcrum;
 - e. Diving well of proper depth

4. Club/Parental Team Support

APPENDIX VI

DIVING & SWIMMING WARM-UP PROCEDURES

Diving

No divers should warm up before a certified diving coach is present.

Swimming

1. Pre-Meet Warm-up

- a. Control / Supervise - key words for safe warm-up
- b. Officials should be actively supervising the warm-up to ensure that proper procedures are followed. They have authority, through referee or swim chairs, over the warm-up. A swimmer and/or a coach may be removed from the deck for interfering with his or her authority.
- c. Coaches are reminded that they are responsible for supervision of their swimmers during a warm-up just as they are when they are on the deck at a practice.

2. Important Points to Remember During Warm-up

- a. There shall be no diving off the blocks or the edge of the pool during the general warm-up -- swimmers must enter the pool feet first for warm-up swims. Orange cones, pylons or chairs should be placed on the starting blocks so that all swimmers are aware that the blocks are not to be used.
- b. THE ONLY TIME A SWIMMER SHALL DIVE INTO THE POOL, i.e., ENTER THE POOL HEAD FIRST, SHALL BE DURING THE SPECIFIC WARM-UP PERIOD WHILE ENTERING A LANE DESIGNATED FOR SPRINTING.
- c. Swimmers need to be aware of the potential for disaster when a swimmer is diving from the block at the same time a backstroker is executing a start from beneath the block. In sprint lanes, the backstrokers shall stand in line with the other swimmers waiting to start from the top of the block. Backstrokers shall enter the water when their turn comes. While a backstroker is in the water preparing for and executing a start, no swimmer shall step onto the block.
- d. Coaches should maintain as much contact with their swimmers as possible -- verbal and visual -- throughout the warm-up period. IT IS THE COACHES' RESPONSIBILITY TO SUPERVISE THEIR SWIMMERS DURING THE WARM-UP.

APPENDIX VII

RULES FOR SECOND TEAM FROM ONE CLUB

1. The Club with two teams competing in the FCSL will submit two rosters to the FCSL president prior to either of the Club's first meets. These rosters shall include the full name of each contestant and the specific team to which he or she has been assigned.
2. No contestant may compete in the first meet for both teams.
3. There is a grace period during which contestants may be reassigned. The grace period ends before each team's second meet.
4. Contestants may be reassigned once, either up or down, at the discretion of his or her coach, before the end of the grace period, at which point the rosters must remain fixed.
5. At the end of the grace period, the Coach must submit a copy of each of his or her final rosters to the FCSL President with the changes from the original noted on a cover sheet. The FCSL President shall be notified of any member who joins either team after the second meet of both Divisions.
6. Weekly meet results for the club's two teams must be forwarded to a member of the Board of Governors whose own club is not competing in either Division to which the double roster club is assigned. These results are for the board member only, whose responsibility is to check for possible misuse of a contestant. Any new member of the team will be noted on a cover sheet accompanying the weekly meet results when that member first competed.
7. The penalty for using a contestant in both Divisions after the grace period is the loss of the meet for which he or she is ineligible.
8. In all other ways, the contestants from the two rosters will be considered as if from separate clubs with all the rights accorded other FCSL contestants. This includes the Championship and Divisional Meets.

GENERAL AMENDMENT

Rules for a particular dual meet may be amended by mutual agreement between the Swim Chairmen of the two clubs involved in that dual meet. Such rules shall not be so amended by the Board, by the Referee, or by agreement between the coaches.

**** FCSL Policy Clarification ** (NOT read aloud at venues)**

UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT

- A. This includes any act the referee deems unsportsmanlike including, but not limited to, the following:
- a) making insulting or derogatory remarks or gestures, or acts such as taunting or language or actions that are unsuitable to friendly competition involving young children;
 - b) trying to influence officials' decisions or flagrant and hostile exhibition of disgust with officials' decisions
 - c) interfering with contestants or meet officials.
- B. Competitors cited for unsportsmanlike conduct will be eliminated from further participation.
If a contestant who causes such an incident has completed any of his or her scheduled diving or swimming events, he or she shall be disqualified from all of his or her previous events with points deducted from the team score, with no additional re-scoring.

Parents, other adults, or team representatives who are cited for unsportsmanlike conduct will be asked to leave the competition area. This penalty will be imposed at the discretion of the referee, but may be requested by either Swim Chair.

RECOMMENDED MINIMUM REFEREE PAYMENTS

The recommended minimum payments for Referees at FCSL dual meets have been changed.

Many clubs choose to pay more than these minimums.

These minimums supersede any lower amounts that may appear in the FCSL General Sports, Swimming, Diving or Water Polo Rules :

Swimming

\$150 per dual meet, plus \$2 per Unofficial (Exhibition) heat.

Payment by the home (host) club.

Diving

\$90 per dual meet. Payment by the home (host) club.

Water Polo

\$50 for first game, \$90 for two games, \$130 for three games.

A second Referee for the Senior game \$50, making a total expense for all three possible games of \$180.

Total paid by the two competing clubs with each club paying half.

APPENDIX XXIII

FCSL SAFETY GUIDE LINES

IMPORTANT

All FCSL Clubs and Coaches with regard to racing starts will complete a Racing Start Certification for every swimmer. Effective date: May 1, 2009.

“Teaching racing starts” will include:

1. All racing start instruction until a swimmer has been certified by his or her coach as proficient in performing a racing start, and
2. All instruction, subsequent to certification, which seeks to alter a swimmer’s basic technique in performing a racing start.

TEACHING RACING STARTS SHALL ONLY TAKE PLACE UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF THE CLUBS SWIM COACH.

The Certification Checklist will be available on the FCSL web site. (Look in Downloads under the Swimming heading.)

USA Swimming Rules Reference :

Pursuant to USA Swimming Rule 504.8, the USA Swimming Board of Directors has decided to amend Rule 103.2.2 (page 43 of the 2007 Rules & Regulations) which specifically applies to teaching racing starts to provide as follows:

103.2 WATER DEPTH –

.2 /M/ Teaching Racing Starts – Minimum water depth for teaching racing starts in any setting from any height starting block or the deck shall be 6 feet (1.84 meters) measured for a distance of 3 feet 3 1/2 inches (1.0 meter) to 16 feet 5 inches (5.0 meters) from the end wall.

This decision has been made with the advice and consent of the Safety Education Committee, the Rules and Regulations Committee, and legal counsel. The purpose of this action is to further protect novice swimmers from accidental bottom strikes while they are learning to execute racing starts. This change is effective immediately.

APPENDIX XXIV

FCSL SWIMSUIT RULING

Only traditional “brief” or jammer suits of any material for boys will be permitted and that only traditional “tank” style suits for girls covering the torso would be permitted.

No one wants to be the suit police and this is SUMMER SWIMMING!

ALSO as of 2009,

New Interpretation regarding the use of more than 1 swimsuit during competition USA Swimming has *revised* the interpretation regarding the use of 2 swimsuits during competition.

The Rules & Regulations Committee has issued an interpretation that only one suit swimsuit is allowed during competition.

A further clarification provided an exception and allowed that a second suit worn for modesty or support purposes would be allowable and would not be considered a second suit.

Racing Start Certification Checklist

Check the appropriate box as each step is satisfactorily demonstrated. Steps 1 through 5 are described with accompanying photos in the American Red Cross Safety Training for Swim Coaches Manual. Access the manual on the coaches' tab at www.usaswimming.org. (See Chapter 2: Head-first Entries and Racing Start Safety.)

Step 1-5 must be observed by the undersigned coach for all swimmers with less than one year of competitive experience or who are 10 years of age or younger

Progression: The swimmer satisfactorily demonstrated the ability to safely enter the water using:

- Step 1; The sitting position
- Step 2: The kneeling position
- Step 3: The compact position
- Step 4; The stride position
- Step 5: A shallow head-first entry

Step 6 must be completed by the coach for all swimmers, regardless of age or experience. Check either one of the boxes below depending on the age and experience of the swimmer:

OR

- For swimmers age 10 years and under and/or swimmers with less than one year of experience: The swimmer has satisfactorily completed the racing start learning progression and demonstrated the ability to safely execute a shallow racing start from a starting block.
- For swimmers age 11 years and older with more than one year experience; Based on prior competitive experience, he swimmer is capable of safely controlling the depth of his or her racing starts.

Based on personal observation, it is the professional judgment of the undersigned coach that the swimmer identified below is capable of performing a shallow racing start on demand and can safely perform a racing start in four feet of water.

- Record keeping options:
 - An individual form signed by the coach for each swimmer
 - An attached roster signed by the coach documenting each swimmer (sample attached).
- This document must be maintained on file with the club listed above for three years.
- Prior to teaching racing starts check and understand the local and state laws regarding water depth.

- The losing team in each division will move down to the next division.
The losing team in Division 4 is the last place team ignoring the team that drops out
- The winning team in Division 2, Division 3 & Division 5 will move up to the next division
- The winning team in Division 4 will stay in their current division

Case 3 – Team drops out from Division 3

- The losing team in each division will move down to the next division.
The losing team in Division 3 is the last place team ignoring the team that drops out
- The winning team in each division will move up to the next division

Case 4 – Team drops out from Division 2

- The losing team in Division 1, Division 3 and Division 4 will move down to the next division.
- The losing team in Division 2 will stay in Division 2
- The winning team in each division will move up to the next division

Case 5 – Team drops out from Division 1

- The losing team in Division 2, Division 3 and Division 4 will move down to the next division.
- The losing team in Division 1 will stay in Division 1
- The winning team in each division will move up to the next division
